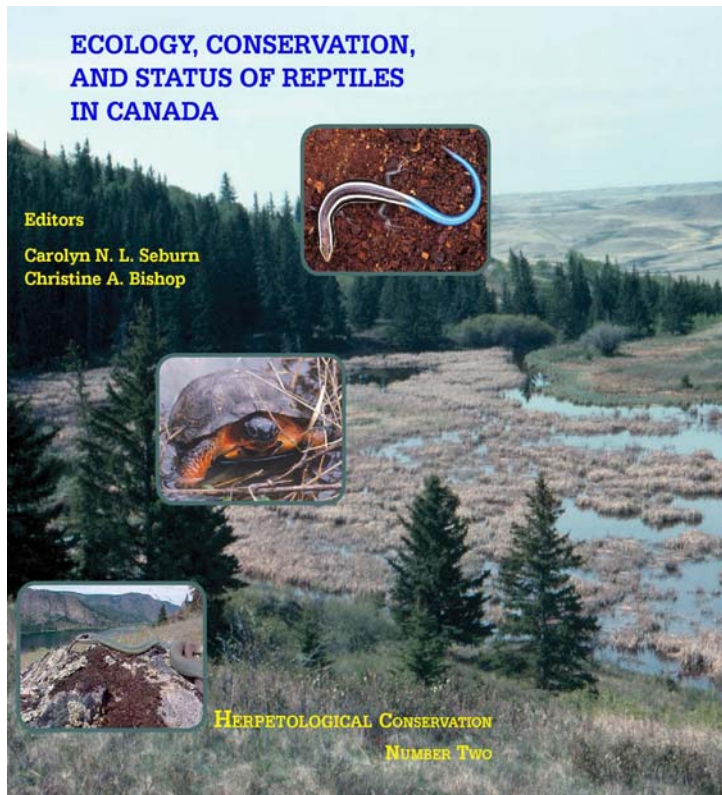

The second volume in the SSAR series Herpetological Conservation presents a current view of the status of the 46 species of reptiles occurring in Canada and Canadian marine waters and the difficult issues faced in their conservation. The 11 chapters, contributed by most of Canada's prominent herpetologists, include overviews of the ecology and conservation of the major groups (turtles, marine turtles, lizards, and snakes) and discussions of issues and conservation tools.

A two-volume set including Herpetological Conservation Volume 1, *Amphibians in Decline: Canadian Studies of a Global Problem*, is also available at a discount.
